President Jack Fennell called the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees to order at 7:00p.m. Trustees present were Jack Esterdahl, Beau Feuchter, Sheila Taylor, Roger Nelson, Eric Keyster and Bob Anderson. The board stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Jack Esterdahl made a motion to accept the minutes from the May 8, 2019 regular meeting. Roger Nelson seconded the motion. Roll call vote- all approved. Motion carried.

Sheila Taylor made a motion to accept the minutes from the May 8, 2019 closed meeting session. Beau Feuchter seconded the motion. Roll call vote- all approved. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Sheila Taylor to pay the bills as presented. Beau Feuchter seconded the motion. Roll call vote- all approved. Motion carried.

#### **TREASURER'S REPORT**

Dwight Johnson reported a normal month of spending, and on budget. The village received \$27,000 from Illinois income tax, the highest ever received. A motion was made by Sheila Taylor to accept the treasurer's report, and Jack Esterdahl seconded the motion. Roll call vote- all approved. Motion carried.

#### **SUPERINTENDENT REPORT**

Dale Bishop is on vacation, and Marcus Loser was present to report on village operations. Mr. Loser reported water and sewer operations are normal. The new dugouts at North Park are finished. Personnel are busy prepping alleys for sealcoating. New siding has been installed on Shaw Road lift station. Mowing schedule is frequent and being accomplished by a high school student, Joey Cooper. IDOT has informed the village that all radar speed signs on Route 91 need to be turned off until school is back in session in the fall. Six ordinance violations were issued this month, and all were taken care of within a few days. The village has received two paint program applications in the amounts of \$150 and \$250. One of the Village Hall air conditioning units has stopped working. The village has several trees with Ash Borer infestation, and we are currently getting bids to have trees removed.

#### **INDIVIDUAL COMMUNICATIONS**

Jenny Murfin, who lives across from North Park, addressed the board about the troublesome parking situation at North Park during the Brad Wallen tournament, and Dunlap Days. Cars are parked on both sides of the road, leaving no room for potentially responding emergency vehicles, and making it hard to see crossing pedestrians. They

had “no parking” signs on the side of the road in their yard, but they have been taken down over recent years under various circumstances. They would like the signs replaced. Discussion followed, and the board concurred that the sign will be replaced as soon as possible.

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Jack Esterdahl- Three trees at North Park and two trees at Central Park will be removed for Emerald Ash Borer. They will be replaced with new trees in the fall. North Park is in need of a concrete pad to move bleachers from west side to the east side of the football field. Jack Fennell adds that the parking lot at North Park needs to be addressed and extended. Communications with the Menold family regarding purchase of the land adjacent to the park have gone silent. We will reach out to see if their position has changed.

Dwight Johnson- S&S Lighting installed all new lighting through an Ameren grant program. A \$6,000 job only cost the village \$900, and it will pay for itself in 6 months. Jack Fennell asked about the lighting for Copperfield Park. Beau Feuchter will look into available options. Discussion of potential future projects were discussed including: sidewalk mounted mailboxes on Breckenridge, curb disintegrating on French Drive, cracked sidewalk on Copperpoint Drive, sink hole on Copperfield, and the dip in the turn lane on northbound 91 at Copperfield. Jack Fennell will be having a meeting regarding the secondary water line for Dunlap.

Jack Fennell would like to have a link on the village webpage for transportation for seniors.

Bob Anderson- The zoning board is looking at adopting an ordinance regulating construction mess/building maintenance. The board is in a research phase for this project.

Dwight Johnson and Tracy Korger reviewed the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) grant kickoff meeting and schedule. The options for funding are local letting vs. state letting. Discussion followed. Sheila Taylor made a motion to approve the state letting option. Eric Keyster seconded the motion. Roll call vote- all approved. Motion carried.

Jack Fennell asked that the SRTS concept plan be added to the Village webpage.

Dunlap night at Peoria Chiefs will be held on August 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Jack Fennell thanked Marcus Loser for such a wonderful job on the siding on Shaw Road lift station. The board overwhelmingly concurred that it looks great.

Sheila Taylor made a motion to adjourn, and Eric Keyster seconded it. Roll call vote- all approved. Motion carried
